









Opioid Settlement and Deputy Wellness

The department will establish a grant program for sheriff's offices and police departments to request funding for the mental health, wellness, and support services for first responders.

A total of \$10 million in recurring funds will be available for this grant program. At least 20% of the available funds must go to fiscally constrained counties. Projects for an office or department must be at least \$50,000 and cannot exceed \$250,000.



Law Enforcement Apprenticeship Program

Fund a statewide law enforcement apprenticeship program already certified by the Florida Department of Education to recruit, select, train, certify and retain Florida deputies who lack the funds to attend a certified law enforcement academy within the State.

This effort, while statewide, will focus primarily on fiscally constrained counties and areas of great need with a goal of building a viable workforce for law enforcement in the State of Florida.




